The boundaries of the European integration project are changing, both geographically and regarding the boundaries between national and European policymaking capacities. While countries from Albania to Ukraine want to join the EU, the UK has opted to leave the Union, and integration with Switzerland is slowly eroding. Likewise, integration is increasing in some policy fields such as fiscal capacity building and military cooperation, stagnating in others, and in some policy fields there is even discussion of a re-nationalization of European competences. The recent crises of the EU – from the Eurozone crisis to the Russian full-scale invasion of Ukraine – have accelerated these developments and invite fresh thinking on polity (re)construction in Europe.

This workshop brings together a diverse group of junior and senior scholars who work on these questions from a variety of perspectives and will consist of paper presentations and roundtables to allow for a broad discussion. It bridges research from two ERC-funded projects on boundary formation in European integration (EUROBORD – Frank Schimmelfennig) and on the mass politics of disintegration (DISINTEGRATION – Stefanie Walter) and puts them into dialogue with other researchers who specialize in topics related to the breadth, depth, and dynamics of European integration.
